CLERK: 11 ayes, 22 nays to overrule the Chair, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have an amendment to the Koch motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Read the amendment.

CLERK: Senator Newell would like to amend the Koch motion to set adjournment at 11:45 p.m. for today and to require thirty votes to adjourn before that time.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I don't like Senator Koch's idea of setting fifteen minutes for debate. I think in some cases it may last longer than that but I think the idea of trying to get through the schedule is a very laudable one, and with that in mind I would to make it clear that we are going to have to work late tonight and that is why I offer this as a substitute motion to the Koch motion. Senator Koch, would you accept that?

SPEAKER MARVEL Read the motion again.
