LB 820

CLERK: Senator Chambers moves to indefinitely postpone LB 820. Senator DeCamp moves to suspend Rule 7, Section 3 so as to consider the kill motion today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to suspend the rules and take up 820 today?

CLERK: The kill motion today, yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Kill motion, okay. All those in favor of the suspension of the rules for that purpose vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? If you suspend the rules, we take up the kill motion on 820 now. Record the vote.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, to suspend the rules to take up the kill motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers, you are recognized on the kill motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, was Senator DeCamp's motion to suspend Rule 7 and Section 3?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The entire section?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, Mr. Chairman, because the entire section has been suspended, I can now do any of the things that that rule would prohibit me from doing so what I would like to do is to offer a substitute motion which is that the provisions of LB 822 be substituted for the provisions of LB 820 and the only thing that would stop me from doing that is Rule 7, Section 3, subdivision d, which says no motion, proposition or subject different from that under consideration shall be admitted under color of amendment. Now I don't really want to offer that but I want you to see what happens when you suspend all of the rule without considering exactly what it is you are trying to do. So in order not to prolong the discussion, I will allow a vote to be taken unless people have questions or want to debate the issue.

SPEAKER MARVER: The motion is the indefinite postponement of 820, is that the motion?
