SENATOR CLARK: Debate is ceased. Senator Cullan, do you wish to close? No closing. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'd just make one remark. As Senator Cullan mentioned, we sat down with John Sullivan, the New Car Dealers Association, and I would like to commend him for doing that because I think he probably had the votes just to go ahead and ignore us completely but they did agree to this amendment. They did agree that the industry would not be hurt and in fact that it might be benefited and I hope when you vote on that you will consider the opinion of the industry itself. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Cullan-Beutler amendment. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Cullan-Beutler amendment.

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
