SENATOR CLARK: Senator Newell, did you wish to talk on this? Your light is still on. The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is to cease debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: We are voting on ceasing debate on the Schmit amendment. Have you all voted on ceasing debate? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Debate is ceased. Senator Schmit, do you have any closing? Senator Koch, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, I am going to use the Beutler rule. Has this amendment received proper discussion on both sides of the issue? Only Senator Schmit.

SENATOR CLARK: I only had one light on. Senator Newell.

SENATOR KOCH: I had mine on.

SENATOR CLARK: We didn't have your light on at the time. Do you want to talk on it?

SENATOR KOCH: My light was on when Senator Schmit offered his amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: I am sorry. I didn't see it. Do you want to talk on the amendment?

SENATOR KOCH: Only for a question of clarification of the introducer of the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Go ahead.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator Schmit, those tickets not cashed now, where does the money go?

SENATOR SCHMIT: They are disbursed among the various county fairs and that sort of disposition (interruption).
