SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol has closed. All those in favor of the adoption of the...we are adopting committee amendments, right? Just the Nichol amendments? Okay. All those in favor of adopting the Nichol amendments vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 29 nays on adoption of the Nichol amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. What is the next motion?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nichol moves to add the emergency clause to the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the emergency clause.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is carried. The emergency clause is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nichol moves to amend. Read Nichol amendment offered: Page 3, line 21, change the word "or" to the word "and".

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Burrows brought this to my attention that he was concerned that livestock syringes could possibly be determined to be that kind of material that would be used for illegal drugs, and if you did have one and used it in that respect, it would be illegal so we changed this from "and" to "or" in accommodation to him. I move the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I want to ask why this concession ought to be granted. First of all, let me ask, Senator Nichol, you offered the amendment, I want to ask you a question or two. Is this type of syringe readily available to a citizen or must there be a prescription to obtain it?
