CLERK: Yes, you do. You had 918A and you need to do that in order to read your bill Friday or you are going to have a problem Friday. Yes, sir. You moved 918 yesterday, I think that is your grasshopper bill, and you need to withdraw the A bill. You made a motion, it laid over and now we need to take up that motion.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, I move that we withdraw 918 A.

SENATOR CLARK: You heard the motion to withdraw the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, maybe I could put something else in there.

SENATOR CLARK: The bong bill? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? It takes 25 votes. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is withdrawn. The motion passes.
