LB 790A, 795

Nobody has ever explained what's it for. I have been told that \$88,000 was spent last year on seminars by county attorneys and deputy county attorneys. So you add 88 and you add 51 and you get a lot of money, and that's all county tax money outside of the \$7,000...well, that's tax money too, that we are taking away from the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center. I ask you, do not give this A bill 30 votes. I withdraw my amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will read on Final Reading LB 790A.

CLERK: (Read LB 790A on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. LB 790A. 790A requires 30 votes. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: How many are excused?

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 1981 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 13 nays, 6 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 795. Before you read...excuse me, just a moment. In the north balcony from Senator Koch's District it's my pleasure to introduce sixty 5th and 6th Grade students from St. Gerald's School, Ralston, Nebraska, three teachers. I think we need to explain to you that we are on Final Reading. It's the final time we look at these bills and the Constitution states that each bill must be read in full. So that is what we are doing at the moment. On this final day we have around 38 to 40 bills to read. The Clerk will read LB 795 on Final Reading.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 795 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. 795 on Final Reading. Have you all voted? Clerk, record
