General Fund that was vetoed by the Governor was \$3,047,130. Of that amount we are recommending override of \$1,539,506. Machine vote is adequate.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: (Mike not activated)...LB 998. Senator Warner indicated that the underlying thesis on these particular veto override requests was to make certain that each state agency had enough money to allow it through frugal use of existing dollars and manipulation of funds to provide state employees with a pay increase of 11 percent, but Senator Warner also indicated that there was one deviation from that and that was in LB 998 and that is with Agency 47, the Educational Television Commission, and he said there specifically that the override is to make certain that our ETV have enough money to be able to purchase the kind of equipment that it needs to update its facilities, and that is a separate and distinct issue it seems to me. So I would ask that the veto override be divided into two parts, the first part affecting everything in 998 that Senator Warner has noted, excepting Agency 47, and the second part, which we will also take up, being to override the veto with respect to Agency 47.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: That's no problem about division of the questions.

CLERK: Senator, I need....

SENATOR WARNER: I didn't quite hear which agencies.

CLERK: I need you to identify for me what you are separating out.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well it's right, Senator, it's right below Jail Standards Board. That's probably not a fair way to identify it but that's the way it is. The division would result....we are talking about LB 998 now, and the division would override the Governor's veto, let's see, Senator Johnson, on everything but 47?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, the division, Senator Marvel, would be to....

SPEAKER MARVEL: You leave Educational Television Commission as is, in other words.
