SENATOR JOHNSON: On this first vote. On the second vote we will come around and take a look at that issue.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. The total figure at the moment is what, \$1,539,586? Is that the figure you have, Pat? Senator Warner, what is the figure?

SENATOR WARNER: For which agency?

SPEAKER MARVEL: 998. LB 998.

SENATOR WARNER: Which agency?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well....

SENATOR WARNER: Or what total?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, I am looking at the totals for 998 and it is in the righthand column.

SENATOR WARNER: Right. The total including all agencies was \$1,539,586 that we were proposing to override.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, then this is the....this is what your motion to override does.

SENATOR WARNER: Oh, excuse me. Without ETV it will be \$897,992.

SPEAKER MARVEL: It will be how much?

SENATOR WARNER: \$897,992....without ETV.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, so the first motion is \$897,992. Okay, the motion now is the override of the Governor's veto in connection with LB 998. All those in favor of overriding the Governor vote aye, opposed vote no. Machine vote again, Senator Warner? All those in favor of the override vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 1994 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Now we go back to the ETV motion. We are still on 998, right?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Johnson.
