PRESIDENT: One more we need. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I move they be closed.

PRESIDENT: No, we need one more. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I will nominate Senator Cal Carsten.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten. All right, now Senator DeCamp do you want to move that nominations be closed and the ballot be cast for the five persons nominated? Is that your motion? All right, the motion then is to close the nominations and cast the ballot for Senators Clark, Warner, Kahle, Marsh and Carsten. All those in favor will vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 44 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The committee is unanimously selected for Committee on Credentials. Now will the committee...Senator Clark, will you take the committee to the rear of the Chamber, retire to the rear of the Chamber.
