PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, it is difficult for me to make a nominating speech as interesting as Senator Chambers, but I do wish to enter the name of Senator Elroy Hefner as Vice Chairman of the Executive Board. For those of you who have been in the Legislature I am sure I need not describe him to you or for what he stands or his integrity, but for those of you who are new, you perhaps have all met him and I highly recommend him to you. Ladies and gentlemen, Mr. Elroy Hefner.
