PRESIDENT: The motion is to caucus for the nomination of the remaining members of the Committee on Committees. Any discussion? All those in favor of Senator Rumery's motion signify by saying aye. Opposed nay. The motion carries. We will proceed with the caucus then by the four districts shown on the sheet which was distributed to you earlier and at this time the 1st District will caucus down here at the northeast, over at the northeast end, 2nd District at the northwest end, or as close to the end as you can get, and the 3rd District at the southeast end, and the 4th District at the southwest. You will just have to separate yourselves enough. So we will proceed to the caucus for the remainder selection of nominees for Committee on Committees. While we are at ease the Chair would like to make an announcement for Mrs. Richard Maresh that the Unicameral Club of Nebraska will be meeting at two p.m. in Room 1517, January 7th. That is today at two o'clock in Room 1517. The only report we have in is the 2nd District so would the caucuses please report to the Clerk's desk as soon as you have finished your labors. We still have to hear from the 3rd District caucus. Would you kindly get the report up so we can proceed. The Chair recognizes the Clerk for the purpose of reporting on the results of the nominations by the four caucuses.

CLERK: Mr. President, from District 1, Senators Wesely, Beutler and Remmers are nominated; from District 2, Senators Labedz, Newell and Koch; from District 3, Senators Lowell Johnson, Schmit and DeCamp are nominated; and from District 4, Senators Kahle, Wagner and Haberman.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is in order then to accept the nominations and declare them elected to the Committee on Committees. Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, I move that the reports of the four districts be accepted and that nomination should close.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I would request that you read the names again slowly for those of us who are trying to write these names down.

PRESIDENT: All right, Mr. Clerk, would you repeat the names so that everyone can get them down before we vote.
