SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, I am. I am sorry I wasn't paying attention to my duties. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, it is my privilege and honor, and Senator Bob told me to say that, to nominate Senator Bob Clark for Intergovernmental Cooperation. Is that it? Senator Clark was a member of the Council of State Governments on the National Board. He is Past Chairman of a Twelve-state Conference and has been fair in my estimation in anything that he has ever done. He is very outspoken but very fair and I have enjoyed sitting here in the first row with him, and any time I have asked him for help he has been very willing and very anxious to give it to me. He has served the past two years as Chairman of Intergovernmental Cooperation and I am asking for the support and very proud to nominate Senator Clark.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, as a former member of that committee and seeing no other nominations, I would like to move that the nominations be closed and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Senator Bob Clark.

PRESIDENT: Motion has been made to close nominations and unanimously elect Senator Clark Chairman of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 mays on the motion to close nominations and to declare Senator Clark elected as Chairman of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Committee.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and Senator Clark is elected Chairman of the Intergovernmental Cooperation once again. We will proceed now with the Rules, but Speaker Marvel has I believe some remarks at this point. The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: It is my privilege to recommend to you for the Rules Chairman for the next two years, Senator Don Wesely. Senator Wesely has been active in the study of Rules during the regular sessions and also has cosponsored legislation, specifically Legislative Resolution 168 which has to do with clarification of Rules itself.
