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ing several issues including calendar and also including rules. So I suggest to you that before Monday you get out the new rule book which is...let's see, Pat, do you have a copy of the new rule book up there?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to hold it up?

CLERK: The blue one?

SPEAKER MARVEL: The blue one, yes, that is the one we are dealing with. Right?

CLERK: Yes, sir. That will be the motion to adopt permanent rules will be the blue book, yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, you will have a rule book, a blue book and I suggest that you go through that rule book and check some of the new rules that have either been adopted or will be adopted. On page 39 of that rule book you will find a rule which affects when we adjourn and I plead with you to read the rules, especially the ones that have to do with committees and the ones that have to do with the possible taking off of several days between now and the end of the session. May I say to you that if you adopt one of those three suggestions as far as the calendar is concerned we can have several days off as far as Fridays are concerned. We can have about four days off at Easter and beyond that I think that if there is no other deviation in this area we can get out of this session some time between the first of June and the fourth. Now the way that we are trying to do it as far as I am concerned, going for the June first deadline and then work backwards. So here is your goal here, then you work backwards here to try to determine how many to be fair to those who have a long ways to go and those that like weekends off, and for instance today, we are only going to meet half a day so we are wasting half a day as far as I am concerned. But the goal will be the first of June. There will be three alternatives. As chairpersons you need to help me Monday morning at nine o'clock in Room 1520, come up with your opinions as to your preferences in these areas. Now, Mr. President, I think that is all of the preaching I am going to do right now but there may be...excuse me, I think Senator Kahle has a question.
