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offered a good compromise as opposed to the original rule we adopted last session. I would hope this body looked at this as reasonable and as an excellent piece of rule change so that it benefits all of us not just the constituents but those who work here each day and I would submit to the public, we are not taking a vacation. If you are going to do your work, you will use this time to prepare yourself to know what is before us for the remainder of this session. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I rise in opposition of this amendment. I feel that we do not need a recess at this particular time. I think that the committee chairmen can schedule the bills with less importance and we can go ahead and hold hearings on them. The bills that need to have a little more research and the ones that we need a little more information on, I think we can schedule those a little later in the session. Therefore, I would have to oppose the Wesley amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, could I inquire...as I understand it the Wesley amendment on page 39 of the blue copy would substitute "5 days" for the words "for one week". Is that correct?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR LAMB: In other words, it seems to me that this amendment is really, well for those who do not want to and do not believe that it is necessary to have a long recess after the ten day period for introduction of bills it is not a compromise at all. It is really capitulation because instead of a week we are going to have five days. That doesn't sound like a compromise to me. Now I have talked with some of the new members of the Legislature who were under the impression that some of the outstate Senators are the ones who sometimes would like to have more time off like Fridays, like other days near holidays and so forth, but as far as I am concerned and as far as I have been able to determine from other members who are from farther west, that is generally not the case, that we are primarily interested in continuing our work in an orderly manner. I think our constituents are quite unhappy when they see us recessing for what does not seem to be really a very good reason.
