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that tenth day in order to let the bill drafter catch up. So if you put this in the rule book as it is proposed under the Wesely amendment, you are building in an inflexibility which I think you will not like down the road. I urge you to vote for my amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is the Lamb amendment to the Wesely amendment. Does anybody wish to have the amendment read or do you understand it? Okay, all those in favor of the Lamb amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 25 nays on adoption of Senator Lamb's motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. We are back to the Wesely amendment. Okay, the Chair recognizes Senator Kahle on the Wesely amendment.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I know we could argue about this a long time and probably not decide very much. What I would like to see and I don't know exactly what the Speaker has in mind or what the Wesely amendment would do, but in this particular year it looks to me like we should...we have already, this is our fourth day, we can either have three or four more days this week, whichever we desire, two days next week, adjourn till the 26th day of January when full committee hearings could be started, four or five days. Then my next recommendation would be that the Speaker not call any Fridays off until we are through with the public hearings because some of our committees do meet on Thursday and Friday and I think it would be unfair for us not to have equal time with the other committees and some of them are going to be loaded pretty well the way it sounds. So what we should do in my estimation is to go ahead and either meet nine days now and save a day either this week or next week, however you want to do it, and have one more day, the 26th of January, when we could introduce the last bills and get things straightened out with the bill drafter that morning and that afternoon we could go ahead with hearings. Now, that may not be exactly what the rules say but I think that would be a solution to our problem and that we would get off to a nice smooth start. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would just like to briefly renew my objection to the so-called compromise. I still believe
