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that the rule in the book is the better rule, but I did want to at least be sure to clarify one point for all of you whether you decide one way or the other. Mention was made that this year will be different than next year, that this year it is Wednesday, Thursday and Friday off. Next year it may be Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday. But as I understand our programming and our schedule, our Legislature always starts on the first Wednesday following the first Monday, therefore the three days of the five calendar days that we are talking about in the Wesely amendment will always be Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of that second week. Okay? So it is never going to be Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and break up a week. It is always going to be Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. That does not make the compromise any better in my opinion, but I wanted to at least be sure you were straight on that. I just want to point out again that all we are talking about is ending by June 1, and if you are going to ignore the public completely and just consider ourselves, then the question to ask yourself is, can we have a shorter Easter vacation and give the public a break with regard to the bills and still end by June 1, and the answer is, yes, because the Speaker has programmed it out already. It is right there. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Are there others who wish to speak?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No.

SENATOR WESELY: I would like to call the question then.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely for the purpose of closing on his amendment.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. In summarizing let me make a few points. I think Senator Beutler and others have helped to clarify the question but let me go through some questions that may still be in your mind. Number one, this rule change applies only to odd numbered years, that is to say, will be effective this session but not the next session. Two years from now again it will be, if we adopt this similar rule two years from now it will again be applicable but not next session. So it only deals with the new introduction of bills at the start of the new Legislature. Secondly, when we talked about the question of, well, you can have a changing situation, Senator Beutler mentioned that we will always start at the
