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it can only set up safeguards so that your exercise of the right will not be interfered with by tyrants of any variety. When people stand up here and say that too many bills are introduced and they don't understand the bills, they should not seek to put their limitations on me. We place differing values on different things. Some people are materialistic so they dress a certain way or drive a certain type of car or live in a certain type house, not for the function that clothing, automobiles or houses have to serve but because of the image which is projected to other people. Since my automobile is not an extension of myself and I feel self-sufficient without a great display, I drive a Honda. Somebody else may need a Lincoln to feel like they are something but the only purpose that I see in a vehicle is to get me from one place to another as quickly as possible and should a bill that I am going to introduce pass, I can get from Lincoln to Omaha at a rate of sixty-five miles an hour instead of fifty-five when it comes to the Legislature. I heard Senator Haberman talk about people introducing too many bills but that some are brought to him and he knows how to say no and he knows how to say yes. The problem is he doesn't know when to say yes and no. He brought some bills in here last time which he became embarrassed about and disenchanted with before it was all over because he didn't understand everything that was involved. So what Senator Haberman ought to do is put skid chains on his tongue, put a muzzle on his mouth and through self-discipline limit himself but there will come no situation in this body when I will docilely sit back and let others try to restrict the manner in which I feel I should represent the people and the interests that I am down here for. I get a check from the state but I am not hired by the state. The state cannot tell me what to do. Nobody else can tell me what to do. They can make suggestions and if I think they have merit I will modify my conduct but to have an arbitrary rule set in place on the Legislature to limit our legislating function I think is a mistake. I look at how arrogant some judges become. Although I am supposed to be an enemy of law enforcement I think one of the worst things that happened recently was when a judge put a police chief in jail for criticizing the judge. You can criticize the President of the United States. You can criticize me even and not go to jail so why should the judge be any better than anybody else. We are talking about the exchange in ideas. If an idea has validity it should be able to scramble for its life in the marketplace of ideas. As Senator DeCamp pointed out, we are dealing in ideas. All that we have to work with are words. We try to embrace certain ideas and concepts related to the public welfare in words and
