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committee chairmen will not treat that very lightly when they find someone who is trying to take advantage. I observed this body this morning and contrary to what Senator Lamb says it will not open that floodgate at all. It will merely give an individual a choice of introducing bills that he or she feels are necessary for public discussion and contrary to what some of you may think, I will not be the one to wheel a wheelbarrow down to Mr. O'Donnell and dump a bunch of bills between now and the time the last day comes and contrary to what some of you may think, the committee which I chair will not be arbitrary and capricious in terms of what we introduce before this final day happens. We are about to adopt the rules and I would hope that those of you who supported the rule change you made a moment ago, the one offered by myself, the one offered by Senator Warner, will in good faith accept it and maintain your courage and adopt the rules as proposed by Senator Wesley. I am also somewhat surprised that those of you who serve in public life, that you cannot understand the general public outside. Let me tell you something about the general public outside. When they need an attorney in terms of a law they hire an attorney. When they need a doctor for heart surgery they hire the best they can find. When they need an expert they will say, I am going to obtain an expert but each and every one of them thinks that they are an expert in government and I submit to you that those who wish to serve all they have to do is pay their filing fee and win and serve to whatever capabilities they have or to whatever philosophies they support. This rule today is one that should have been adopted a long time ago and those of you who bring up Senator Carpenter, many of you can only remember the name. Senator Carpenter was an outstanding senator and occasionally he had some bills floating around certainly but that was to serve, that was to serve public interest groups who oftentimes were selfish that he might bring them upstairs and put some pressure upon them.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Your time is up, Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: So I submit to you, the business before this body in all seriousness is to adopt the rules so we can proceed with the business at hand which is legislating to the best of our ability. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Chairman, I call for the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. All those in favor
