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three bills that I have been working on and I would dearly love to introduce but which I have pretty well given up a chance to introduce because of limitations. Now I have a chance to introduce those bills. I think they are good bills but that is all the additional bills I will be looking at and for those of you that believe in the limitations we now have, well it is your individual option to say, no, I will not introduce any more bills than I planned to whether they be five or six or one or two, that is a choice you can make and it is one that I think you should make and you will be doing your part to represent your constituents who have told you they don't want more bills in the Legislature but allow those of us who are interested in issues who have ideas on how we can improve the life in Nebraska a chance to introduce those ideas and have a chance to pass those and I would like to defer the rest of my time to Senator DeCamp, please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, in the last, oh, I would say thirty minutes, we have all sat through something that you are going to see happen quite a bit in the next couple of years and it is a phenomena that you did not even realize was happening and that we are all guilty of. What am I talking about? Senator Haberman, Senator Peterson, Senator Fenger, all the people, Senator Beutler particularly, all the people that talked about the floodgate raised the Carpenter, the Terry Carpenter specter. Not one of you ever served with Terry Carpenter. Now, the other half of the phenomena was all the people who served with this monster or legend or whatever, Senator Warner, Gerry Koch who was around as a lobbyist, Senator DeCamp, Senator Chambers, despite all this specter and terrible things you were told about, they are all the ones saying, yes, let the individual be not unlimited but not limited. I think you are using the wrong word. Let him be responsible for his actions. Now do you know why I think we all are taking that attitude, because we also watched what happened, the other half of the story with Terry Carpenter? When he introduced eight jillion bills, when he abused it, and there was abuse and I think they know it, the committees promptly killed them, made a joke of it and everybody learned from that. Now the final chapter is that when we put the limitations on, if you will go back during that period of years, I think it was four or five between the time Terry Carpenter left and the time the limitations were imposed, go back and find any abuses. Go back and find any serious abuses. Most of the bills, in fact I would say the individuals that introduced the most
