SPEAKER MARVEL: Your time is up.

SENATOR DeCAMP: ...amendments or otherwise.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will read the amendment that

we are going to vote on.

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, the Wesely proposal as amended would allow for unlimited introduction by individual legislators and would decrease the limitation on committees from presently ten bills per committee to eight bills per committee. It would also include the Appropriations Committee within the committee bill limitation process.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the Wesely amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Wesely, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR WESELY: How many members are absent?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Three excused.

SENATOR WESELY: Who are they, please?

CLERK: Senators Sieck, Hoagland and Maresh.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 19 mays on adoption of the Wesely amend-

ment as amended, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The amendment is adopted. What else do we have on the Clerk's desk?

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, we now need to adopt that

rule as part of the permanent rules.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, at this point we have that section of the rules which we now need to adopt
