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understand what we are doing now is making Rule 5, Section 5, as a permanent part of the rules. Is this correct? Okay, I rise to oppose this and the reason that I oppose this, the reason I oppose this so much is because I think we need to place ourselves on some restrictions. We all know that the people out there, our constituents, are continually saying, you introduce too many bills down there. We can't keep up with them. We don't know what bill is where and when we want to come down and testify on a bill, we just don't know where we are at. I noticed that in some of our committee hearings that committee chairmen will say, we can only have an hour on this particular bill and sometimes I have had constituents drive several hundred miles to testify on a bill but they were not able to testify because we did not have enough time to listen to them. We had to get on to the next bill and I think that if we would limit ourselves to the number of bills that we would introduce, we would not have this problem. I know that many of you will use restrictions on yourself but there are others that we know of that will not. Another concern of mine is that several good colleagues of mine, Senator DeCamp and Senator Chambers, are on the same side and I think that needs to be a concern of all of us and so, therefore, I would urge you to oppose this motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman and then Senator Dworak.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator DeCamp, take the limit off, take the limit off. That is what we are talking about. Okay. Let's take the limit off the debate, it says ten minutes to open, five minutes to close. Why censure the Legislature? If we are going to take the limits off and make it a free Legislature let's take the limit off of debate. Let's take the limit off on staff. Let every legislator be responsible for how many members of staff that he has. Let's take the limit off of travel. Let every legislator stand up and be counted and be accountable for his travel. Let's take the limit off the number of fish that we...oh, excuse me, I didn't mean to say that. Let's take it off... the limit on the...at the end of the session, the limit of time we can spend on bills on Select File. We put a time limit that we can spend on those bills. So as long as we are taking off limits, let's take them all off and put the responsibility as you are saying upon the individual senators and I hope that I don't have to say that I oppose this.
