three sections of the rules and now have the remaining sections to yet be adopted. They are grouped together and are open for amendment. There are several amendments that have been proposed I know by Senator Chambers. I don't know if others have proposed other amendments but we have to deal with those and then hopefully this afternoon after we have worked our way through those rule changes be able to adopt the final sections of the rules and adopt permanent rules for this session. So we are very close to completing the rules debate I hope and we will be able to complete it this afternoon. I think we are now ready to handle the first rule change that is on the Clerk's desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first proposal I have is offered by Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers moves to amend Rule 1, Section 2 by striking the word "Chaplain", and strike all of Section 21 on page 7.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, so that you can follow, the first part of the proposed amendment is on page 1 of your rule book, the 2nd portion is on page 7, and would be section 21 on page 7. They both relate to the Chaplain. Because the Legislature has decided not to appoint a Chaplain, it would not be appropriate to have a rule which states that a Chaplain will be appointed. So since there is to be no Chaplain, there should be no language in the rules related to one and that is the amendment. So if you have any questions, I would be prepared to answer them.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Dworak. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: I have an amendment on the desk, Mr. Speaker.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dworak moves to amend the Chambers motion by strike...well, the effect of Senator Dworak's motion will be to strike what Senator Chambers is trying to do and strike the word "Chaplain" and insert "Chaplain Coordinator".

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to read that once more?

CLERK: Mr. President...(interruption).

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, the amendment should be written as amending Senator Chambers' amendment
