SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, with the permission of the Chair and the Legislature. I wish to withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objection, so ordered. What is the next item?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the desk. Well, I shouldn't say that, we need to adopt the Division 4 as part of the permanent rules.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: That was the original motion which brought us to the discussion that we have carried through now for two days, so I think it is appropriate at this time to move finally for the adoption of the permanent rules under the Division 4 that we went through. Now just to recall for you, we divided the rules into four different The first three have already been adopted. sections. They are now the permanent rules of the Legislature that includes the provision concerning bill limitations. That has been adopted. It is the permanent rules of the Legislature. Now we need a complete with the final fourth section, division, of the rules, the complete rules and that will take care of our discussion of the rules for this year. From this point forward if there are rules changes they will have to come through the Rules Committee and will have to be adopted by 30 votes on the floor of the Legislature. So you will not have to have this sort of rules discussion throughout the rest of this session but you will be brought various rules changes by the Rules Committee at various points throughout the rest of the session but not nearly as frequently as you have the last few days.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is Senator Wesely's motion. Senator Chambers, your light is on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and Senator Wesely, so that I am clear, will this portion be adopted, then there will be a vote to adopt the whole package of this that we have talked about today, that's all that is left?

SENATOR WESELY: That is all that is left, Senator Chambers. We have already adopted the other three sections.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I am not going to debate or delay the Legislature any further, but because of what was done on that Chaplain and prayer issue, I must vote no, and I want the record clear as to precisely what I am voting no to.
