Now if a motion is made to suspend the rule or whatever and we do it in the proper manner that is allowable by the system then I can't quarrel with that, I just lost. But I am not in favor of an arbitrary declaration that this will be the way it is in disregard of the rules and everything else. So I will have to plot my courses as I always have, sometimes being charming and gracious, other times being obnoxious but whatever the situation calls for, that is what I am bound to do and right now I cannot agree to a proposition where a motion must be made with no opportunity for amendment simply because it is stated that that is the way it will be.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker and members, first of all I want to make a confession. I think a lot of you are blaming Senator Beutler for causing the problems that we apparently have created yesterday. I have some compatriots in this row of seats and around us here and I will not stand by and let Senator Beutler take all the flak. If there is anything I have heard in the four years that I have been down here it is, for goodness sake, don't introduce so many bills.
