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responsibility has been so diluted between various other committees that you can almost abolish the committee and I am going to tell you now that one committee could hear every bill and give it a fair hearing. But if we continue to argue about nonsense there is going to be one less member here until I find out you have addressed the matter of rules, then I will come back and I will promise you this, that when someone pops up with an amendment to an amendment for the purpose of harassment or the purpose of delay, that there are others in here who are going to do the same thing and we always waste a lot of time at the first of the session and then with the last five or six or seven or ten days, we deal with revenue bills and appropriation bills in a hurry and that is the reverse of what it ought to be.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Your time is up. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, let me try and review for you the situation that we are in presently concerning the rules and emphasize some of the concerns I have. First off, we have discussed now, this is the fourth day that we have discussed the rules in this body. In discussions with Senator Marvel and others who have been here for many years, they don't recall another time when we have spent as many days concerning the rules at the start of the session. We have taken a great deal of time to try and accommodate every individual the opportunity to speak about the rules, to discuss the rules, to amend the rules. We have spent three days, this is our fourth day, we have resolved a number of issues but we have left the majority of the rules to adopt as permanent rules. Now Senator Schmit hit the main problem, the main situation that we have yet to resolve and that is with the bill limitation question. That is what seems to be concerning people still. Well let me tell you that we have already adopted the section of the rules as permanent rules, that section dealing with bill limitations. That has been adopted. That is the permanent rule of the Legislature and it is already in place. To change that will take a suspension of the rules. It will also take thirty votes to change because it is the permanent rules of the Legislature. That issue is moot unless you can get the thirty votes to get back to it but I am telling you we have already adopted that section of the rules as we have also adopted the section of the rules dealing with the five day recess. Now those are the only two sections of the rules that we have adopted as permanent rules. So we have the 99% of the rules that we have discussed again for three days yet to be adopted as permanent rules. Now when we discussed these rule changes and we took the time with them, I want
