SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Kilgarin, and then Senator Johnson, Vard Johnson.

SENATOR KILGARIN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I am keeping a daily journal of my experiences and my thoughts of this legislative body. I would like to read to you my entry into the journal regarding this matter at hand, the rules debate. Strict observance of this body over the last seven days clearly proves that members must see or at least create an illusion of purpose in their efforts.
