SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion before the House is the adoption of the Maresh amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: How many are excused?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Five excused.

SENATOR MARESH: I think we have only forty people voting. Let's have a roll call vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Clerk will call the roll. The issue before the House is the adoption of the Maresh amendment.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 179 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Is there another motion before the House?

CLERK: (Read Stoney amendment as found on page 179 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Stoney.
