SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, I think we are at a point here where we must stop and reflect for a moment or two about what exactly is entailed in this motion. Now what it basically entails is that we will reject everything that we have done so far this last five days of rules making or discussions or debating and go back to those rules that we had before. SENATOR CLARK: Too much noise?

SENATOR NEWELL: It would help if just anybody would listen.

SENATOR CLARK: (gavel.) Could we have a little quiet please. It is not very courteous to do this.

SENATOR NEWELL: One more attempt to try to make myself heard if anybody would just...if some would give me a little bit of attention, I would like to clarify where this brings us. It says we, for the last five days of debating the rules we will forget all that because that is not important anymore. All the rules that we have adopted and debated and so forth, we no longer are going to worry about. We are going to send all that new stuff and so forth back to the committee to be debated at our leisure later on when we are much busier in the session. It means that we do, however, for those people that want to establish the...for those people who want to put the limitations back in, it will allow us to go back to that limitation so that is a real positive thing for some people. The fact is that we will debate all these things again because they will be recommended to the Rules Committee and probably will come out of that Rules Committee. Senator Beutler sits in that committee and what we will really end up doing is not only having wasted a great deal of time now trying to figure out where we are to be and what we want to do but we will have that same opportunity again and in the process, in
