be your closing I assume. The question then before the House is the suspension of Rule 5, Section 11 to permit withdrawal of LB 191. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay, and this will require 30 votes. Record the vote.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Rule 5, Section 11 is suspended. The next motion then.

CLERK: The next motion then is, Mr. President, to withdraw LB 191 and cancel the public hearing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I move that LB 191 be withdrawn and the public hearing cancelled please.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Motion is to withdraw LB 191 and cancel the public hearing. Hearing none, all those in favor of the withdrawal and the cancellation of the hearing on LB 191 vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and LB 191 is withdrawn and the public hearing will be cancelled. At this point the Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: One more item today. As soon as the business on the desk is completed, we need to recess temporarily so that any chairmen who have bills that need to be advanced or any business they need to do with the Clerk they can do it before we adjourn. So is the business...are you ready to recess?

PRESIDENT: Why don't we stand at ease, Mr. Speaker. Wouldn't that be better? We will be at ease until you call them back into session, why don't we do that? But just as the Speaker has indicated, the Clerk just reminds me that the reason we are doing this is so that the chairmen can get those reports up to the desk so that we can proceed. So until that is done, the Speaker won't be able to call you back in session. The Legislature is at ease.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would like to have the Rules Committee meet underneath the South balcony for a brief meeting, the Rules Committee underneath the South balcony.
