it is for those who have bills that are in the process of being considered. So I am generally opposed to bracketing. We have allowed three or four examples of this and I would plead with you in the future to try to conduct your business without postponing legislation. You will find at the end of this long session that there are going to be several bills laid over and it is almost impossible in the short session to confront the bills. That is my long-winded answer.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Speaker, I appreciate what you said and I would be happy to abide by that decision. So, as far as this particular bill or anything else that wants to be bracketed merely for the purpose of delaying it, I would urge the body to go ahead and face the music now, make the decision on this bill whether you do or don't want to introduce it. So I would go along with the Speaker and hope that you do too. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, would you like to close on your motion?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would, Mr. Speaker. I don't generally approve of bracketing either but what I disapprove of even more than bracketing is having something pop up on the floor with no prior notice to anybody in the Legislature that it is about to happen. Now we went through the process a couple years ago of trying to straighten out our processess and trying to give everybody in this Legislature notice the night before of everything that was coming up on the agenda the next day and I think that we should be able to rely upon that. I think that everybody should be able to prepare based on that agenda and that, to me, is the most important point. And, Mr. Speaker, I would request that I will withdraw the bracketing motion and at the same time I would request that the Speaker withdraw the item from the agenda on the basis that no prior notice was given of the item.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You are saying, in effect, that the request for the introduction of the bill would be laid over until tomorrow?

SENATOR BEUTLER: As the Speaker sets the agenda, Mr. Speaker, so, as you decide.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there objection to Senator Beutler withdrawing his motion on bracketing? Hearing no objection, so ordered. The Chair will conclude that the bill needs to be set or the request needs to be set for discussion and I will take this up with Senator Newell. For what purpose do you arise, Senator Newell?
