

SENATOR LAMB: Okay, it would be five dollars for the permit and then one dollar for one duplicate permit but you are tightening it down, I might add, in that under the present law you have unlimited duplicate permits and under this amendment you would only be allowing one duplicate permit at the one dollar fee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Vickers, are you speaking to the bill as a whole now or the amendment? Are you speaking to the bill as a whole?

SENATOR VICKERS: No, to the amendment. This is Senator Lamb's amendment, right? Senator Lamb's amendment to the Nichol amendment, is that correct?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, really I guess I am speaking to the... about a problem that Senator Lamb brought forth and I understand that concern but I would point out, I think Senator Labeledz attempted to, but I am not sure she had the right section and Section 73-1103, motor vehicles are required to have a permanently attached sticker except those motor vehicles that fit under this statute and it mentions motor vehicles being operated by the holders of easements across permit areas or their agents, employees or contractors. So that does give the rancher the authority to drive through without a permit if he has an easement to get across the park area. I know I had some problem with this in a portion of my district where some of the farmers needed to get across so I think that does satisfy that concern. I sympathize with those people that attempt to get duplicate permits and as Senator Labeledz pointed out we did in the committee attempt to have one duplicate permit. It has in the past been misused by some people we were told that had a number of duplicate permits and there was no way to tell how many but I did want to simply point that out, Senator Lamb, and others that might be concerned with that area, that it was possible to get an easement across for those people involved with agriculture or ranching and needed to get across state park land.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I rise to oppose the Lamb amendment to the amendment. When it was agreed on a few days ago that all permits would be five dollars and I understood Senator Labeledz at that time to say that it is possible to get an easement across there without paying anything. I saw nothing wrong with that and still don't oppose the idea of farmers and ranchers being
