

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, this is amendment number two. Shall the House go under Call. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Okay, record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 19 nays to go under Call Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Record vote please.

CLERK: Record vote on that one Senator?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Record vote on the amendment Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: A record vote.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would like to request a record vote on the pending amendment.

CLERK: Okay.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the second Beutler amendment. All those in favor of that motion vote aye. Opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: Read record vote as found on page 946 of the Legislative Journal. 16 ayes, 25 nays, 4 present and not voting, and 4 excused and not voting.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. What is the next item?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler moves to amend the committee amendments. Read Beutler amendment as it appears on page 946 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature without further legislative action we can now have a vet college that will cost us 15 million, if it gets built, or it may just cost us 1.3 million without having anything at all. The next amendment says very simply that the total number of Nebraska students enrolled at any one time at the Regional College of Veterinary Medicine shall not exceed 50% of the total number of students enrolled.
