SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you mean along the line? Yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Well it had its priority yesterday so if we bring it back today wouldn't that mean that everybody else that has a priority bill should be given a second chance the next day and the ones with priority bills at the bottom of the list may never get their priorities heard. I just ask that question. I have not checked the rules myself yet, but I am wondering how you bring it back the next day when it has already been given its priority.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well so far you have all raised good points. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have another one.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I am not ignoring you, Senator Higgins, Senator Chambers had a comment first.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, now...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I did not select a priority bill but since we are kind of stymied this morning and all the bills seem controversial, the introducers are not here, I have one that was designed to put some due process safeguards into the law relative to radar. They are provisions that are all a matter of case law and if the body was willing to review that bill, it is LB 413, I would be willing to take that up at this time. If we are going to just pass over everything then we are not going to get anything done anyway.

SPEAKER MARVEL: May I make this comment to some questions that were posed? We are going to have a chairmen's meeting tomorrow and determine the status of bills that have already had an exposure. So I guess, Senator Chambers, what I would say to you at the moment is that we need time today and that as far as I am concerned, there has to be a way to send a bill like LB 40 to the bottom of the pile and what I will do is work on this today and discuss this with the chairmen tomorrow and come back with an announcement. Senator Vickers, do you have a comment?

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I would like to ask you a question, if I may.
