

about adopting first of all, #1, 3, 4, 5. Is that right, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. That is right.

SPEAKER MARVEL: 1, 3, 4 and 5, Senator Marsh, and then the second item is #2. That is the one you object to, I think. Senator Carsten, do you want to explain 1, 3, 4 and 5 first on page 766?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, those sections are the sections that we deleted that all go together which dealt with the lid portion which we felt did not belong in there. That is what those are.

SPEAKER MARVEL: So the first motion is the adoption of 1, 3, 4 and 5 as found on page 766. Is that right? Okay, that is your motion. Senator Schmit, do you wish to respond to the motion on page 766?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Could I ask Senator Carsten a question, please?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Carsten, do you yield?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator Carsten, how much money are we referring to here? Is there a specific amount of money?

SENATOR CARSTEN: No, there is no specific amount. At the time, Senator Schmit, of the committee action on the amendments we had no idea and at this point I would say that we have no idea of the specific amount either because it will depend upon at the time that the allocations are made what that interest dollar figure would be and we hear figures ranging all the way from 1.5 to 2.2 to 2.5. And I think we really don't know the dollar figure and it is not included in here, no.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Does this portion...is your amendment now in two portions, Senator Carsten?

SENATOR CARSTEN: That is my understanding, that the Chair has divided it. We deleted...the first part of the motion then is the deletion of the reference to the 7% lid that was struck. The interest portion is the second part of the amendment and he has divided them as I understand.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Would you give me the complete rundown of the committee amendments as you have got them outlined there?
