and I would hope that you would give me a chance to explain it and so, therefore, I am going to vote against this amendment at this time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, I really don't have any objection to the first part of the split. So I would rather talk on the second part. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I guess I am in the same position as Senator Kahle. I don't see any problem with the adoption of...as I understand it, the first part of the amendment. I will reserve my comments for part two of the amendment. I don't see any problem with the first part.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Carsten, your light is on.

SENATOR CARSTEN: I was going to talk on the portion of the second part of the amendment that Senator Marsh was objecting to and I apologize to you, sir. I will turn it off. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: What is the motion now before the House? We argued about an amendment now...excuse me? Okay, you are talking about strike original section 6 to 11, et cetera, that portion of the amendment that Senator Marsh is opposed to. Pardon me? Will somebody please phrase the proposition so that we can proceed?

SENATOR MARSH: The first, third, fourth fifth and sixth may be put into one motion and section 2 should be the second motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You are opposed to the second item and you are reasonably favorable to 1, 3, 4 and 5. Is that right? Okay, so the motion, first of all, is the adoption of 1, 3, 4 and 5 of LB 284 on page 766 of the Journal. Is that right? Okay, that motion is before the House. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, Mr. President, for the record did you want me to move only that portion or is it clear enough on the record as it is?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, I think we had better move it that way so that there is no objection to a division of the question.
