

Antelope County will have equalized values as a result of this. Additionally we will get as much as we reasonably can with the consent of another thirty-two people here for my area of the state and so before you reject out of hand, any amendment or all amendments, look at the whole picture and see if we can't get something that is reasonably fair to you, reasonably fair to you as an individual senator and reasonably fair to the state.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: A question of Senator DeCamp if he would yield.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator DeCamp, on the most recent action that I want to speak to is the \$2,000,000.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, sir.

SENATOR KOCH: Since it is now part of the total dollar, if I understand it correctly that means that there is some subdivisions of government that are going to receive money that actually they do not deserve so because they probably didn't borrow money. So we are going to reward them. Others who did borrow because of a lack of that money, are going to get just a percentage according to the formula. So, what I am saying is that I didn't get to speak to the adoption of amendment two. I can probably support you and others in the intent of 284, however, I have real problems with giving back \$2,000,000, some going to get and don't deserve it and I will give you an example of schools. They normally borrow money and they borrow when their property tax funds come in late or they are waiting for them to come in as they are now. That is not unusual for schools to borrow money. So what I am afraid of is we are going to dish back \$2,000,000 and everyone is going to share in it even though they didn't have to borrow simply because we had a problem with the formula and so here I am voicing my objection to the amendment two we just adopted. I think we are better off to take \$70,000,000, turn it back under the formula which we are about to adopt obviously and keep the \$2,000,000 here and possibly use it for other good purposes that may help the subdivisions of government in return.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Could I just say the flip side of the coin, though subdivision X may not have had to borrow money, subdivision X would have had that money from the state, would have
