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that is all we are issued. We have to buy several but we only get one per car. As far as I know, as of this time, there has never been any problem with the law enforcement agencies stopping me whenever they deemed it necessary. Therefore, I would concur that one license plate is all that we need. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Newell, did you wish to speak?

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I would like to know how many lights you have got on?

SENATOR NICHOL: We have six or seven. After you that is.

SENATOR NEWELL: I would like to call the question. Did I do good? I did good.

SENATOR NICHOL: Do I see five hands? I do. The question is shall debate cease, all those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Senator Haberman, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR HABERMAN: A point of order, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: State your point.

SENATOR HABERMAN: This is my amendment and I don't believe that I had an opportunity to speak on it.

SENATOR NICHOL: No, I think it is Senator Maresh's amendment, sir.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well yeah, sure, but it is my amendment to have one license plate.

SENATOR NICHOL: Now that you have stated your point.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Beings that it is my amendment being attacked and being changed, I think I ought to have an opportunity to speak on it.

SENATOR NICHOL: Then you may vote in opposition to the question before. . . .

SENATOR HABERMAN: Oh absolutely, Mr. President, but I was going to ask you to rule that due to me being the prime introducer of the amendment for the one license plate.....

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Haberman, excuse me, Senator Newell wishes to withdraw his request.
