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SENATOR NEWELL: Temporarily.

SENATOR NICHOL: Well, if it is withdrawn, it will be withdrawn for awhile. Thank you, Senator Newell. Thank you, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR NEWELL: If I could I would like to cede my five minutes to Senator Haberman and then hopefully the person who is next up after me would be kind enough to call the question.

SENATOR NICHOL: I don't know if you can do that.

SENATOR NEWELL: Well I can use my five minutes can't I and I can give it to anybody. Senator Haberman, would you yield for a long question?

SENATOR NICHOL: No, I'm going to rule against that, Senator Newell, since you used your beginning to call the question which you have done. If you wish to overrule the Chair, go ahead. Otherwise we will go on to the list as we have it.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. Chairman, I withdrew my motion. I do have the floor, don't I, if I withdraw my motion?

SENATOR NICHOL: No, I made the rule that you don't have the floor since you made your motion and then withdrew it. If you would like, at the end of the list again I would be happy to do that. Is that okay?

SENATOR NEWELL: I won't fight with you, Bill.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I think Senator DeCamp has very cleverly brought the issue into a safety issue as to whether we have two or one plates. I don't believe Senator Maresh or Senator Kahle or Senator Hefner indicated safety is the major reason for two plates opposed to one plate. I think their reasoning was very clearly law enforcement and also tradition and also some personal satisfaction that they personally receive driving down the road, country road, to be able to see if somebody is from the county or somebody is from outside the county. So I think that that was erroneous and that was false analogy that Senator DeCamp drew. I would like to yield the rest of my time to Senator Haberman, Mr. President, I would like to yield the rest of my time to Senator Haberman if he would like to take it.
