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sincere. My only purpose is to save the money and have one plate. That is my only purpose. I didn't go to anybody, nobody came to me. Didn't make any deals, but now it looks like there is really some wheeling and dealing going on. Because if you can save two million by changing firms and save two million by having one plate that is four million dollars. That is a lot of money.

SENATOR NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I would have to ask you to vote against advancing the bill, and we will come around again with my amendment and put it back on to have one plate. I'll ask you people who voted for it before to vote for it again. If you want any questions answered I'll just be as always, been perfectly honest with you and come right across the board and tell you what is what. I won't play any games with you. I don't think that I have ever played any games with you down here and I never will. So I would ask you to vote no on the advancement. Let's let this thing settle down for awhile. Give me more time to get 25 votes to take that amendment off, that is what we are doing, what I am asking you to do. Senator Clark is sitting there shaking his head saying no, don't do that.

SENATOR NICHOL: Time is up.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, Senator Clark, I am sorry. Let's have a no vote on this. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Clark, but before you speak I would like to introduce some friends of Senator Higgins. Under the south balcony she has her niece, Mrs. Helen Ayers and her daughter Elaine and a friend, Mrs. Carole Wirahan. Would you please rise and be recognized. Thank you. Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, members, I think the opposition has done a very good job of dividing everyone here. You can see what has happened. There is no doubt about it. I checked with policemen, I checked with patrolmen, I was home for three days and they are adamant to have two license plates. I don't care if they have one or two but they are adamant to have two license plates. That is what Senator Higgins found out in Omaha. You talk about saving two million dollars if we have one license plate, that won't do it. You put out six million license plates in two years, you'll only put out three million in two years
