So I say this, if there is going to be some meetings to set up some issues, to straighten this out, that is fine, and if somebody isn't invited to those meetings, that is fine also. Set up your own meeting, come in with a compact plan and get things together. So I say this, instead of criticizing these people, I think we ought to be helping them and I don't care if it is Johnny DeCamp or Senator Chambers or Dave Newell. When somebody tries to put something together that is going to work in this Legislature, that is going to help the citizens, then we should go along with it, and if it is going to take another day, it is going to take another day. But you try to figure it out on this floor and it is going to take weeks and weeks and weeks and we don't have the time, and if you think the patience are running out and running short now, try to do this on the floor and see what happens when the Speaker loses his patience. So I ask you to have a little faith and trust and lay it over for the day or the two days to let them work something out. Thank you, Mr. President.

I am willing to discuss 284 anytime in a reasonable fashion with some degree of intellect without emotion, and for us to cast blame upon individuals on this floor who try occasionally to get together and come
