

SENATOR LAMB: Well, Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator DeCamp. This does have a termination on it. Is that correct?

SENATOR DeCAMP: As proposed, the amendment has a termination. I stated when I made my opening that whatever the will of the body was in that particular aspect I really have no strong feelings because I have in the bill a proposal that mandates using the former Schmit intent language that the Revenue Committee come up with a proposal by January 1, 1983.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you. Well, Mr. Chairman, members, we have been looking at this other amendment which really it is just a variation of what we considered before. I guess at this point I would like to have additional time which we don't have at this point to discuss the two proposals which are before us, one of them which a number of people have not had an opportunity to study. So, at this point I would just suggest that it might be better to not act on it at this point so that we can properly evaluate an amendment which Senator DeCamp has and this alternate amendment which would basically eliminate all reference to revenue sharing. There would be nothing in that regard in this other amendment either and it would distribute the \$70,000,000 on the basis of the amendment which Senator Schmit presented the other day. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: I think we will stop right here. Now whether this is taken up this afternoon will certainly be up to the Speaker but I have four more lights on and there is no way in the world we can do this. Senator Marsh, would you like to recess us until one-thirty?

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, thank you very much. Mr. Speaker, I move that we recess until one-thirty this afternoon.

SENATOR CLARK: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye, opposed. We are adjourned until one-thirty, or are recessed until one-thirty.
