clause, and I think you will remember I withdrew my amendment which involved the sunset clause and so I am suggesting that to be consistent there should be no sunset clause on this, that anytime there is a movement, enough votes in the Legislature, 25 votes, to change the taxing structure, it can be done with or without the sunset clause, and I would just mildly ask you to remove the sunset clause and adopt this amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: All those in favor of the Lamb amendment vote aye. All those opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, Mr. Chairman, I guess we are close enough that we should probably have to...how many are excused today?

SENATOR CLARK: Three.

SENATOR LAMB: Oh, well that is not very many, is it? Who are they? I am getting coached here by Senator Hefner. Who all is excused?

SENATOR CLARK: Quite a stalling tactic.
