CLERK: 10 ayes, 1 nay, to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All Senators will take their seats and check in, please. If you are sitting in your seats, please check in. Senator Wagner, do you want to accept call ins?

SENATOR WAGNER: Certainly would.

CLERK: Senator Maresh changing from no to yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Will you check in, please? Senator Koch, would you check in, please? Senator Goll, would you check in? Senator Cullan. Senator Landis, will you check in, please? Senator Beutler, Senator Sieck. The Clerk will accept call in votes.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp changing from yes to no.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Wagner, I am going to call the vote unless you want a roll call vote.

SENATOR WAGNER: Yes, roll call vote unless we have got 25.

SENATOR CLARK: Do you want me to call the vote?
