provision wouldn't be held in a position where they had to vote for certain other issues. As you well know, I would love to see the Revenue Committee come up with some other method of distributing funds in the State of Nebraska, and that includes the local option sales tax as well as the \$70 million fund. And I truly believe that something needs to be looked at, but I guess I think the integrity of this body is high enough that it will be looked at. I think the Revenue Committee will examine it. I think other members of this body will introduce legislation doing that, and I don't think it needs to have a sunset provision on it to do it. I also agree with Senator Lamb, we just got through doing this. I think it would be ridiculous to stand up and undo what we have just got through doing. One other point I think needs to be made, however, Senator Lamb mentioned that some other...not all of the other taxing issues have sunset provisions on them and that is certainly true, but he did mention state aid to education and the fact of the matter is state aid to education is an Appropriations decision each year. There is nothing there unless the Appropriations Committee decides to put it there, and that is I suppose as it should be perhaps. At least that has been the way it has operated in the past. I don't happen to think that that is probably the best way but that is the way it has happened. But I do oppose the Newell...or the Wesely amendment to put the sunset provision back on, and I would point out once again that what is sauce for the goose should be sauce for the gander. If it is good for Omaha to not have a sunset provision on the sales tax extension, it should be good for the rest of the state to not have a sunset provision on this issue.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President, I move the question.

SENATOR CLARK: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote nay.
