It just basically clears it, it is technical in nature. I would ask for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, for those of you who may not have been aware, I voted against LB 134 when it moved. I want to support LB 134 and believe I can do so with full faith if Senator Wagner's amendment is adopted. It does clear up a picky point and I urge your acceptance of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Mr. President, I discussed this with Senator Wagner. It seems to me a technical change that is a worthwhile one and certainly should be supported.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? All right, Senator Wagner, you may close on your motion.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker, members, I would like to also indicate we did check this off with the Disclosure and Accountability Commissioner, Mr. Winslow (sic), and they are very much in agreement with this amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question then is the adoption of the Wagner amendment to LB 134. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The Wagner amendment is adopted. Is there any further amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Fenger now moves to indefinitely postpone the bill. That will lay the bill over, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: That will be laid over and I guess that concludes all of the bills on Select File. We are then ready to come to agenda item #7. The Speaker has as the first bill under priority bills, LB 95, Mr. Clerk.
