coaches are allowed to do things that are even worse than that. If the senators spend the money for these various items for which some have spent this money, they are at least not in violation of any law, not in violation of any rule, not in violation of any regulation or any other prohibition. On the one hand you cannot spend money to buy clothes but you can spend money to influence the election of yourself, the obtaining of passage or defeat of a ballot question or the defeat of your oppment. Now what does a candidate look like if he is going to wear a suit or she is going to wear a suit with ring around the collar? With sweat stains under the arms? With buttons missing? With egg on the necktie? Why, a candidate must present a decent appearance so they should be able to spend money to at least clean their clothes. Now I don't live in a part of the state where it is necessary for me to wear cowboy boots to keep mud and other semiliquid substances off of my footwear but in case certain people do they should have the right to spend money which they obtained for campaign purposes to clean and have their footwear polished. What is wrong with that? Personal services, I presume that would include visits to the barber or the beautician and I have no personal interest in any politician coming to the barbershop where I work to get a haircut. I wouldn't cut a politician's hair. Senator Stoney suggested their throat but I don't think they would be allowed to pay me for that. Now they cannot spend this money raised for campaign purposes for securities or commodities but there is nothing about insurance. Could a person take this money and take out a very high priced life insurance policy and pay it up? Certainly, or liability or car insurance or any other item not mentioned. I think what ought to be done with this bill, although I have mixed emotions, is to kill it and I would encourage any senator who has the gall, audacity or whatever it takes to raise as much money as possible from lobbyists and anybody else who has got money that they are willing to give to a politician for any reason and spend that money in the most notoriously noncampaign purpose possible. Go out to the horse race and gamble legally. Lay in huge supplies of liquor and if the public gets angry, tell them where to go. They want the senators to beg. Now the only legitimate way of begging right now and admitting it and even reporting it is when you are raising money for campaign purposes

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have thirty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...so in order to keep some kind of an idea of what kind of money a politician is receiving, don't restrict the definition of campaign purposes because then you will force politicians to go under the table as you
