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he will not disagree with anything I have said. He knows what we are dealing with and I think he will watch with interest and no surprise as the people jump the fence and come to the other side. But, Senator DeCamp, where I was on the other vote, that is where I will stay and I don't think that surprises you either, does it?

PRESIDENT: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Well, it looks like it's bean time, Mr. President and members, but I can't help but talk a little bit about this. We have been accused of all kinds of things by those who for some reason or other want population in the formula, and that is what the fight is about. There is just no question about it, whether you talk school aid or whether you talk population, you are talking about the same thing. And what I am saying is that when we started out with this issue, before I came down here in about '72 or so and then again in '77, when I was here, we were talking about relief for some property tax for those that were paying on equipment each and every year, knowing perhaps full well if we took this off some of it would go on real estate tax is exactly what has happened. You can hit the issue all you want to but it deals with real estate, and what we are saying today is that we are going to use real estate values to determine that amount, and I have a rough time trying to understand the Attorney General when he says that we don't have any current information. You evidently haven't kept up with your assessor very well lately, because it is pretty current. They are doing some things right now that are going to change the value of your property, and if that isn't current I don't know what is. Now, the other thing the Attorney General says, well, you haven't established a need. Well, that's news, because as soon as you budget money you have got a need, and the subdivisions that budgeted this money have a need and that's the reason I am supporting 284 with the DeCamp amendment for that very need and I think it relates very well to how that money was collected before when we had the personal property tax. Certainly, real estate values have more to do with it than population ever had or ever will have. So I hope you will support this bill and get it back on General File and, sure we are going to have to talk about it in the future, everybody knows that. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wiitala.

SENATOR WIITALA: Mr. President, I move that we recess
