

any public employee becomes suspect. In the case of sunshinism, every public official is suspect. Every ism immediately starts out by flipping the standards of the past, the hundred or two hundred or five hundred year standards are reversed. What did the standard used to be for public employees? You hired somebody, you hired them because you thought they were going to do a job, you thought they were loyal and you didn't suspect them, the new standard. Every public employee was immediately suspect as a spy. That is why they came to work for the government, they were spies. Sunshinism, everybody who runs for public office has to have all kinds of safeguards because they must run for public office to line their pockets, to take advantage, so on and so forth. So every ism, as I say, starts out by flipping the standards of the past that have held for a hundred years or more and develops a new one. Now with every ism of course, once you have flipped the standards, you have to start developing a system to make the new standards work. McCarthyism, remember? Loyalty oaths, every public official and then every state passed laws so every school teacher, every county person working had to take a loyalty oath starting out saying, "I am not a Communist spy. I am good. I have never belonged to such and such an organization. I am not this, I am not that, I am not seeking to overthrow the government." Sunshinism, I am not in public office to line my pockets. I have this. I got this from there. My relatives want this. I got this loan from a bank. I bought this firm. I did this, I did that. Proving in advance that really you are not in there for the ignoble or immoral purpose. What was the old standard? Public service. That is gone. Now every one of the isms as it gets going, as it gets going it develops a system for enforcement of the new standards. McCarthyism, HUAC, remember HUAAC, House UnAmerican Activity Committee? Tens of thousands of allegations, secret, anonymous, so on and so forth were turned over to them and investigated. The country went wild trying to find out where all the "pinkoes" and fellow travelers were. Every public employee was scared to open their mouths. Why? Because if you questioned these things that was obviously the best evidence that you were one of the suspicious ones. Somebody that says, McCarthy was going out of line or they were bending the Constitution, you were doing that because you were refusing loyalty oaths because obviously you had something to hide. Sunshinism, you questioned the Accountability Commission. You questioned common cause whose only purpose is noble, then you are suspect and you are bad. There was a man who represented during McCarthyism the very essence of how the system handles things and shuts you up. A man named J. Robert Openheimer, (phonetic). Somebody sent an allegation that J. Robert Openheimer was
