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my proposal it is. What about the attorneys? That is under my proposal. There is a lot more accountability. When I make my closing on this particular proposal I will detail the fact that of the expenditures I made, contrary to what Mr. Hoagland and others have repeatedly stated, there were no, by any identifiable standard, personal expenses.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker and members, I would like to have a question of Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, sir.

SENATOR WAGNER: Okay, Senator DeCamp, on Section 2, we are talking about candidates here now, can you or would you take the time to kind of run down through there because it looks like it has a little different concept and kind of explain just what is a candidate and so forth? How do you see it?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Senator Wagner, for all practical purposes there is no change whatsoever. A candidate is a candidtate. the same as under our existing law, the same as under sunshine. As I say, the essence of the new proposal is that we put the reporting, the enforcement under traditional offices, the Executive Board for filing of lobbyists reports. the Secretary of State for filing of conflict of interest and the otner reports. We do use one checking account with all records of that checking account, all money have to go into it and all money out of it of a particular candidate or the various committees. They would each have their own separate account. All that would have to be a matter of public record. I stated to you that the real difference is we are eliminating the Accountability Commission and making more strict reporting and that is why I suspect people that really want accountability would vote for it. People that want to harp on accountability will vote against it because I changed the thousand dollars that you don't have to report to a hundred. I changed the hundred dollars to fifty dollars which we have talked about in the past. I changed the system so that you have to keep a record of what you did with your money. Senator Fowler, my good friend Senator Fowler and Mr. Sellentin I guess spent a hundred or two hundred thousand dollars. To the best of my knowledge you could read all of those reports all week up there and you wouldn't know whether they still have fifty thousand dollars in cars or whatever, whatever has happened to it. You have to keep a running account under my proposal for example as to what happened to your assets, where did your money go, what happened after that. Was it something that was simply expended and doesn't show up again? I am
